Now she is setting up shop in the first purpose built studio arts complex for artists and craftspeople in the UK – Persistence Works in Sheffield.

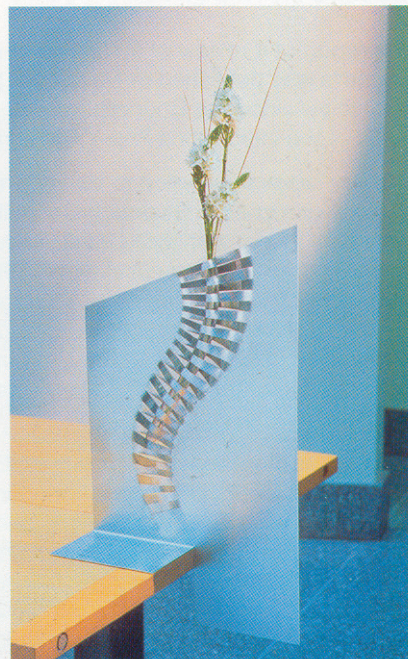
